9. CORRESPONDENCE:

An invitation from the Nottinghamshire Building Preservation Trust Limited to nominate buildings for entry in the Harry Johnson Award 2008 was reported. It was agreed that if Councillors wished to make a nomination, they should let the Town Clerk know as soon as possible.

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10. OBSERVATIONS FROM MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC:

(a) Butt Field Project

Mr. McRobie thanked Councillor Purdue-Horan on behalf of Bingham Town Youth Football Club for all his help and support during his term of office, especially in relation to the Butt Field Project.

(b) Community Centre

Mr. Fowler enquired as to when negotiations with the Methodist Church might start. The Town Mayor indicated that the Community Building Working Group would be reconstituted at the first Community Committee meeting, and that all matters relating to negotiations would then be addressed by the Working Group.

(c) Eco Town

Mr. Fowler expressed the hope that the town's Borough Councillors would do their best at the forthcoming Rushcliffe Borough Council meeting and enquired if the public would be allowed to comment at that meeting and whether all Town Councillors were going to observe. The Town Mayor replied that the public could not participate and it was not known, at this time, how many Town Councillors would be able to attend.

11. PUBLIC BODIES (ADMISSION TO MEETINGS) ACT 1960

RESOLVED that the public and press be excluded from the remainder of the meeting in view of the confidential nature of the business about to be transacted.

12. BUTT FIELD PROJECT TENDERS:

The Council considered a report and recommendations from the Butt Field Project Working Group meeting held earlier that day concerning tenders received for the proposed new sports pavilion.

It was **Moved** by Councillor Kerry, **Seconded** by Councillor Purdue-Horan, and

RESOLVED that:-

1. The lowest priced tender (with correction on the preliminaries), submitted by Beaufort Construction Limited be accepted to incorporate a ground source heating system.
2. Grant aid applications be made to help offset the extra costs of the ground source heating system.

3. The costs of dealing with the contamination issue and additional testing be noted, and the Policy & Resources Committee be asked to determine how reserves need to be adjusted and/or explore the possibility of utilising Community Chest funding to meet the contamination work costs.
4. The Working Group be informed that every opportunity to make realistic savings in the project must be made in order to minimise costs from now on.
