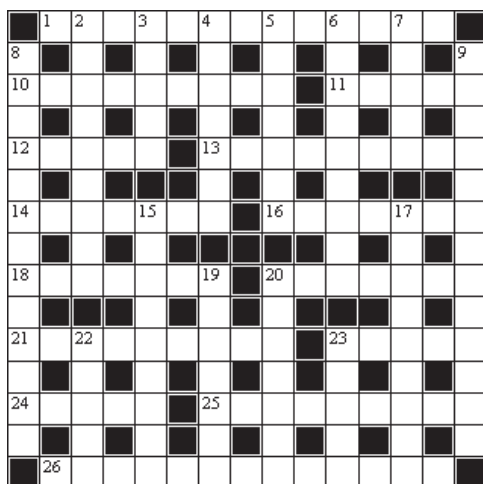

ONE WAY SYSTEM

PARKING RESTRICTIONS CHERRY STREET & FOSTERS LANE

Notts. County Council are designing a scheme to cover Parking Restrictions on Cherry Street/Church Street & Fosters Lane. Public consultation will take place prior to this being carried out.

BINGHAM RAILWAY STATION

There are new ramps on both sides of the station platform to assist with getting on and off the train, but unfortunately there is still only the stepped bridge to cross the actual train line from the north side.

PARKING

In the New Year Rushcliffe Borough Council will be reviewing the parking within the whole of the Borough. This will obviously include Bingham and should be well publicised.
